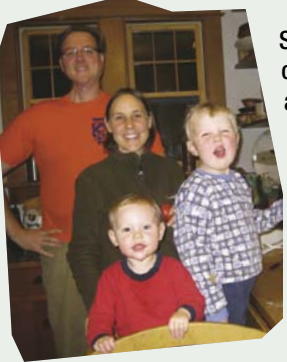


MEET A FEW Z^{ER}O-WASTE HEROES IN OUR COMMUNITY...

Please sort your materials into these categories and set them out by 7 a.m.

Paper and Cardboard



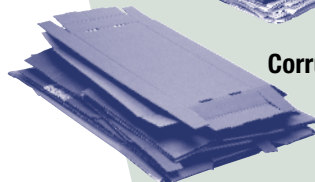
Boxboard

crackers, cereal, pasta, toothpaste, etc. (pop and beer boxes, too!)



Newspaper

with inserts



Corrugated Cardboard

flatten to 3ft x 3ft



Magazines, Mail, Phonebooks & Office Paper

please put shredded paper in a closed paper bag



Please put these items together in a bin or paper bag. No plastic bags!



NO:

- No paper towel or toilet paper tubes
- No egg cartons
- No pizza boxes
- No paper cups or plates
- No napkins
- No refrigerated or frozen food boxes
- No boxes with food or grease
- No tissue or wrapping paper

Put in a sturdy plastic bag. Fasten it tightly and clearly label it CLOTHES AND LINENS.

Clothes and Linens

PAIRS ONLY!



Reusable Clean Items Only

torn & worn items are OK
clean fabric scraps & rags are OK



NO:

- No wet or dirty items
- No dirty or soiled rags

Bottles and Cans



Steel & Aluminum Cans, Foil & Trays

rinse clean, labels are OK

Milk Cartons & Juice Boxes

including soy milk, soup, & broth cartons
remove caps, rinse clean, flatten



Glass Bottles & Jars

rinse clean, remove caps & lids

Plastic Bottles with a ♻️ or ♻️

rinse clean, remove caps, flatten



Please put these items together in a bin or paper bag. No plastic bags!



NO:

- No plastic tubs (like yogurt)
- No produce, deli, or take-out containers
- No plastic toys
- No dishes or cookware
- No ceramics or pottery
- No Styrofoam
- No window glass or mirrors
- No aerosol cans
- No scrap metal
- No motor oil bottles
- No bottles used for home needle disposal

How to recycle in your neighborhood



Set out your recycling materials by 7 a.m.

To ensure your materials are collected, always set your recycling out by 7 a.m., or the night before your collection day. Sometimes our routes change and we may come through your neighborhood at a different time of day from week to week.



Mark your calendar for holiday collection

Your collection day may be delayed one day if it falls on or after these observed holidays **only**: Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day (2012).
